Child

- Below eighteen years of age;
- Over eighteen years but are unable to fully take care of themselves or protect themselves from abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation or discrimination;
- Learners who may be eighteen years of age or older but are in school

Corporal Punishment

• What kind of punishment:

Penalty for alleged or actual offense

Purpose:

Discipline, training, or control

Perpetrator:

Teacher, School Administrator, an adult, or another child who has been given or has assumed authority or responsibility for punishment or discipline







Corporal Punishment

- Blows;
- Striking child's face or head;
- Pulling hair, twisting joints, cutting or piercing skin;
- Dragging, pushing, or throwing;
- Deprivation of a child's basic needs as a form of punishment;
- Deliberate exposure to fire, ice, water, smoke, sunlight
- Forcing a child to swallow substances, dangerous chemicals
- Tying up a child
- Verbal abuse or assaults







Prevention

- Capacity Building activities for Teaching and Non-Teaching Personnel
- Implementation of awareness raising activities







Acting on Corporal Punishment

- Punitive Measures
 - Administrative Liability
 - Suspension
 - Dismissal from service
 - This is without prejudice to the filing of criminal case in court

- The Department of Education (DepEd) issues the enclosed policy on the Creation of the Child Protection Unit (CPU) under the Office of the Undersecretary for Field Operations, Palarong Pambansa Secretariat, and DepEd Employees Associations Coordinating Office and the Child Rights in Education Desk (CREDe) under the Office of the Undersecretary for Legal Affairs in the Department.
- Pursuant to the 1987 Constitution, the State shall protect and promote the right of all children to accessible and quality basic education. Alongside this right is the constitutional policy that the State shall promote and protect their holistic development through the promotion of their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being.
